When you are in a federal court:

Other than when writing out the full case name, you should only capitalize the word "court" if:

- 1/ writing out a full case name,
- 2/ referring to the Supreme Court of the United States (SCOTUS), and
- 3/ referring to your court in your case.

When you are in a state court:

Other than when writing out the full case name, you should only capitalize the word "court" if:

- 1/ writing out a full case name,
- 2/ referring to SCOTUS,
- 3/ referring to your court in your case, and
- 4/ referring to the highest court in your state.
